Family Conversations

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

Jesus gave up a lot for us. Why do you think He did it? • If it was our family who arrived first at the empty tomb, how would we have responded? • What does Jesus' resurrection mean for our family?

Bible Memory: Family Dance Party

Look up 2 Corinthians 5:17 in the Bible. Read it together at dinner and help kids memorize the verse.

In Jesus, we're new creations—celebrate with a family dance party! Play the song "2 Corinthians 5:17 (New Creation)" by The Rizers from the [Created New Elementary Spotify playlist](#), and make up a dance routine to the song. Get everyone involved and even assign dance solos for different people in your family!

Record the final dance performance on your phone and watch it together as a family. You'll have fun, get moving, and memorize Scripture all at the same time!

Hands On - Tasty Tombs

Create an edible craft as a reminder that the tomb is empty. Jesus is alive!

OPTION 1: Pineapple Tombs

Carefully cut a pineapple into slices 1-2" thick. Cut the core from each slice so it's a flat circle. Then cut each slice in half so it's shaped like an arch. Use green food coloring to transform coconut flakes into delicious grass.

Give each person in your family a plate, an arch-shaped slice of pineapple (the tomb entrance), a flat circular pineapple core (the stone that was rolled away), and coconut flakes (grass) so they can arrange the items like a scene at the tomb.

OPTION 2: Sweet Tombs

Cut chocolate donuts in half so they're shaped like an arch. Have each person in your family place a large graham cracker on a plate and cover it with green frosting. Then have them create empty-tomb scenes on top of their graham crackers using half of a donut as the tomb entrance and a chocolate sandwich cookie as the stone that was rolled away.

FOR BOTH OPTIONS: Use toothpicks and slips of paper to create mini flags that say, "Jesus Is Alive!"
