GOD'S BIG STORY:

Create It!
Finding Faithfulness

To help kids understand where God has shown His faithfulness in your family, draw a picture or gather photos and make a collage with each family member.

Take time to think through and recall details about each person's life. See if you can find God's faithfulness in their stories. Are there obstacles they overcame? What were some of the highs and lows they experienced? What talents do they have and how did those come about?

Take it one step further by drawing members of Abraham's family, such as Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, and Rebekah. Ask your family:

Where do you see God's faithfulness in the lives of Abraham's family? • Can you find any patterns or similarities in how God showed His faithfulness to Abraham's family and how God has shown His faithfulness to our family?



Family Conversations

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

If you had to describe what faithfulness is to a friend, what would you say? • What are ways God showed His faithfulness to people in the Bible? • What are ways God has shown His faithfulness to you?



Hands On - Faithful Follow

Abraham was already quite old and childless when God promised him a big family. God didn't reveal all the details of His plan to Abraham, but Abraham chose to follow God's direction, and God was faithful to Abraham! As a family, do one or both of the following activities to illustrate the idea of following and trusting God even when we don't know the details of His plan:

1. Choose a new recipe and carefully follow the recipe's directions together. Talk about how following God might be like following a recipe: life might be messy, some of the events in our lives don't seem very good, etc.
2. Choose a new, plastic brick toy set to build together as a family, but make sure only one person knows what's being built. Carefully follow the instructions one step at a time. Once your family has finished building, admire and celebrate what you have created.

Hopefully your family's project turned out great (or delicious)! Talk together about how following instructions is similar to trusting God's faithfulness. God doesn't always reveal every detail of His plan, but He does ask us to follow Him. When we do, it's always worth it.
