Create It! Self-Portrait Art Show

Gather some basic craft supplies to create family self-portraits. You can use paper and markers, or you can grab paper plates, glue, and yarn for a mixed-media approach. Each member of your family will create a portrait of themselves. (To mix it up, pick names out of a hat and draw a portrait of one of your family members.) Take turns revealing each portrait once completed.

To celebrate each portrait, host a family art show. Display and talk about each portrait. Conduct an interview with each artist and discuss the following questions together:

- What is the most important thing about you (or the family member you drew)? Did you draw that in this portrait?
- What are some traits that make you (or your family member) special?
- What are some of God's unique traits we see in Jesus?



Family Conversations

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

What do you like about being part of this family? • *What does it mean to be part of God's family?* • *How can we invite other people to experience being part of God's family?*



Bible Memory: Word of Wonder Scramble

Practice the Word of Wonder at home by creating your own Word Scramble! Gather some paper, markers, and a pair of scissors. Write out the Word of Wonder onto a blank sheet of paper in three- or four-word phrases (don't forget the reference!). Leave plenty of space between each word and each line. Once you've written it out together, cut the Word of Wonder up into smaller phrases. Mix up the pieces on the floor or a table and put them back together like a puzzle.

If you want a challenge, each member of the family can make their own puzzle, and then you can make it a timed race! Who can unscramble the Word of Wonder the fastest?

Discuss the Word of Wonder after you've practiced it. Here are some questions to get you started:

- Who is God's Son?
- What does this verse tell us about God and His Son?
- How can we tell God how wonderful He is today?
